

HYDERABAD: If the main venue of Telangana Formation Day celebrations was the roads surrounding Hussainsagar on Sunday midnight, where spectacular fireworks set the sky alight, Monday saw festivities all across the city.

Various state government departments, civil liberties groups, and joint action committees (JACs) joined the celebrations at important junctions and people continued to burst crackers. Several groups reached the Gun Park memorial and paid tributes to the martyrs of Telangana struggle.

Students of Government Divyadisha Hostel in Uppal performed a traditional dance near the memorial. Mansa, a seventh grade student of Uppal ZP High School and a resident of the hostel said, "We have learnt so much about Telangana struggle recently that we wanted to come here and pay tributes. We wish all the best for the future of Telangana." Mallikarjun, physical director at the school, added, "When students were committing suicide for the cause of Telangana, I travelled 12,000 km on bike across 10 districts and gathered 10 lakh signatures for a petition for T-state. I feel content and happy today."

In the adjacent public gardens, the Telangana Horticulture JAC organised cultural programmes and sumptuous feast for employees. They performed Bathukamma dance, Bonalu and also sang Telangana anthem before moving to the martyrs' memorial.

The road leading to the Parade Grounds, where Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao addressed a gathering, was choc-a-bloc. Party workers waving pink flags could be seen anywhere. People greeted each other with handshakes and hugs. Traditional Telangana cultural songs blared from moving vehicles, to which people danced with joy. "Jai Telangana" slogans echoed everywhere.


## Metro Ra
